# British Extravaganza by Joel Justin



The British Extravaganza is a Vintage Auto Racing Association (VARA) race weekend where British cars are featured. It is held each year in May at Buttonwillow Raceway Park just west of Bakersfield. I've always wanted to go, but the timing was never right. This year, in addition to British Extravaganza, they were also hosting the Kastner Cup.

Who is Kas Kastner and what's the Kastner Cup you ask? Kas Kastner was Triumph's North American Competition Director in the early 1960's. He developed many of the performance enhancements for the Triumph factory Works cars. He wrote Competition Preparation manuals for each Triumph model and more recently published a series of four books on the same subject. Anyone who has made performance modifications to their Triumph has more than likely read Kas' books.

The Kastner Cup is an all Triumph powered race. Almost two decades ago, the first Kastner Cup was held at Mosport in Canada. It rotates to different venues each year. The winner isn't necessarily the person who wins the race. Kas selects the winner based on competitive results (50%), presentation of the car (25%) and attitude of the driver (25%).

If you know me, you know I have this thing for Triumphs, so that made this year's British Extravaganza a "must-attend" event. While this wasn't an official club outing, there was quite a bit of interest and we had a good showing. Pam and I in our TR4, Terry and Dave in their Jag XK150, Glen in his Midget, Martin and Chris in their GT6 all arrived Friday evening. Martin drove up Hwy 5 while the rest of us took Hwy 33. After settling in at the Best Western Hotel, and meeting a whole contingent from Moss Motors, the CCBCC gang headed up the freeway a few miles to a restaurant called Willow Ranch. They had a big table for us and we enjoyed a great BBQ. There were many racers at the restaurant as well.

We were all in the British Car Show they were having in conjunction with the races, so we got an early start to the track. After getting checked in and getting our swag, we found the car show parking which was right on the other side of the pit wall. There was a grass area with some trees right behind us, so we couldn't have asked for a better spot.

There was on-track action all day. In addition to the plethora of British cars in general, and Triumphs in particular, there were lots of other cool vintage race cars as well. The other cool thing is we were able to wander the paddock and get up close to all the race cars as well as talk to their owners.

Other CCBCC members showed up throughout the morning; Craig and Kathy in their TR6, Mike in his TR6, Neal in his TR6, Doug in his TR6 and Martin in his TR6. Hmmm, sounds like all the TR6 owners aren't Friday people!

One of the fun parts of Saturday was at lunch, all the car show participants got to do parade laps around the track. We did three total laps and it was fun to drop back a bit and then do a little spirited driving thru some of the turns.

The Kastner Cup race was the last of the day and we all enjoyed watching the Triumphs (along with a couple of Morgans) zip around the track. The race winner was a TR8 followed by Kas Kastner's Peter Brock designed TR250K. After the race, we all stayed and enjoyed a BBQ at the track. Neal, Mike, Doug and Martin all decided to head home that evening (boy, those TR6 guys don't know how to enjoy a weekend! Or maybe they just really missed their wives?).

Four of us returned on Sunday to watch more racing and for the actual car show awards. The all British race was just before lunch and the TR4's did very well, taking 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place. After they presented the awards for that race, they presented the car show awards. And guess what? All of us won awards!

Dave and Terry got Best Jaguar AND Best of Show. Craig and Kathy got Best TR6. Pam and I got Best TR4. And Glen got Best Spitfire. But wait you say. Glen had an MG Midget! There were no Spitfires, so all of us voted him Best Spitfire Midget, and since there was no competition, he won!




