

NEW MEMBER PROFILE

As a new member of Central Coast Triumphs I've been asked to submit this personal profile, never an easy thing to do but here goes ... My name is Stuart Rigler and I recently moved to Santa Barbara with my girlfriend of nearly seven years Jody Garrison. I am originally from Dorset England and Jody hails from Fullerton in Orange County though we have both grown up in the Detroit area. Obviously, we decided to move to escape the brutal cold of Michigan and naturally the idea of actually being able to drive a Triumph year round holds great promise!

Cars have always been a great interest of mine and upon graduating high school found myself in a position to buy my first TR6, something that I'd been lusting after for years. The car was a Sienna '72 which I kept for two years and it was this Triumph that got me involved in The Detroit Triumph

Sportscar Club (DTSC).

DTSC is the second oldest Triumph club in the US and was founded in 1959, being preceeded by only Triumph Travellers in California in 1958. We generally averaged around 150 members with most members owning at least one car with many actually owning three or more. We had by far more sixes than anything else - thirty six at last count. Spitfires ran a close second with thirty two registered. Mixed in to the rest was at least one model from each series right down to a '53 Vanguard and a '57 Standard 10! DTSC is also the proverbial home of The Vintage Triumph Register (VTR) and is still the base for people such as Randy Mason, Herb Hummer, Bill Smith and Dan Gaitens, names you might recognize from your infrequent VTR newsletters.

In my second year in DTSC I started serving on the club's newsletter staff which published 'Triumph Review' formerly 'The Roadrunner', a twelve to sixteen page monthly sounding board. 1985 saw me voted into the position of Secretary and also to a position on the club's Board of Directors. That same year I took over as Editor of the Review relieving the burned-out soul who had toiled at it previously. I published the Review for two years until I too was worn down, but by that time I had been voted into the President's position which I held during 1986.

Following my Presidency was a year as Chairman which is largely an automatic move for all former club presidents. During my time in DTSC Jody volunteered to take over as membership chairman, a position in which she performed well for one year - 1986. I also ran several rallies and helped out on numerous autocross events. Our club was very Concours oriented and we managed to present at least one show per month for our members. Except in the depths of a Michigan winter we usually held at least three events of some kind every month. In 1984 I was on the organising committee for the North American Triumph Challenge and VTR National Convention, an event that grew out of some joint annual meetings between Irv Korey's Chicago club and DTSC back in the '70s. Jody and I also managed to attend NATC XI in Pennsylvania in 1986, probably the best Triumph event imaginable, what with Charles Runyan's fabulous Roadster Factory blow out that hosted over six hundred people! I have also served as a judge for TR6s and Stags at NATC and have held the job of Concours chairman for the past few years at Battle of the Brits in Detroit, the largest British car gathering in the area.

As far as cars that I have owned are concerned, I've already mentioned the machine that got the ball rolling:
my '72 TR6. This was sold and a '73 Stag with a bad motor made itself available the same weekend, which I promptly purchased with the intention of fixing and running. To make a long story short it has become a long running restoration and is presently in storage in Goleta awaiting the straightening of the body which has been stripped to the last nut and bolt. The paint was completely removed top and bottom and the car is now clothed in a coat of zinc-chromate primer.

In the meantime I've owned (in no particular order) a '69 Spitfire, a '67 TR4A IRS, a TR7, a full race Mk.I Capri, that I built to roadrace, a very hot 1275 Mk. IV '79 Mini, and last of all another '73 Stag that I drove all summer and sold before I left. We also sold Jody's '73 TR6 that was purchased with at least 300,000 miles and sold with far more as it was her sole transport for two years. It performed admirably until the end when it started to get a bit tired.

Two years ago I imported a Daimler DS420 Limousine from England and this still resides in Michigan. It seems that I started a ball rolling in our family as my father now owns a Series II E-Type and a Healey Sprite, my mother runs a Series I XJ6, my sister had a '76 Spit and my brother presently owns a beautiful '74 TVR 2500M (for sale) and three Minis; two woodies and a Monte Carlo replica with a turbo, all right-hand-drive!

At the moment I might be on the look-out for a nice '70-'72 TR6 so if you find one - give us a shout! We're glad to be back in another club and hope we have half as much fun as we had in the last one!


