






Not exactly a snap-together but it's on its way!


Heavy competition made for an exciting spectator event!

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Alarming Isn't It

Auto alarms have been around for quite a few years and are now being seen as production items on many new cars. I remember putting one on my Mustang while in college because it was so easy to break into. It was a basic model which had grounding pins at the doors, hood and trunk. It also used to short out whenever it rained waking the neighborhood at 2am! Lynn and I have recently put a state-of-the-art unit in our 1969 El Camino. The units out now have remote arm/disarm key rings, glass breakage sensors, motion sensors and even valet switches to disarm while you are working on the car. The cost is not cheap these days but a little extra security helps keep would-be thieves from stealing something from the car or the car itself. These units are available at numerous places and I suggest that you have it professionally installed to guarantee it will work correctly. On our alarm installation, the only obvious change to the appearance of the car was a small l.e.d. light attached to the dashboard which indicates if the alarm is on, off or was triggered while you were away. Other than that, the unit is completely hidden from view. If you drive your car every day and want that additional security you may want to attend the next meeting and hear Chris Coatsworth of Car Tronics in Ventura discuss various systems!





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Security - Tech Tip

One of the easiest ways to prevent a would-be thief from starting the car is to ground the coil so the engine will not start. I have done this on several cars I have owned by hiding a switch under the dash which has a wire connected to the distributor side of the coil. The other side of the switch is grounded to the car frame. When the switch is thrown, any attempt to start the car will result in the electricity from the coil to the distributor points being shorted to the car frame. The result is an engine which will turn by the starter but never fire up. Unless a crafty thief finds your switch. A few years ago, a newsletter from the S.C.T.O.A. featured an article on this very subject with a little addition. A fuse was inserted in the line from the ignition switch to the coil. When the switch was thrown and the car attempted to start the fuse would blow. Even if a thief finds the switch, the fuse must also be replaced. Below is a diagram of how this works. One word of caution though, always keep a few extra fuses somewhere as you will no doubt forget about the switch.

SHIELDS BREWING CO

The SHIELDS BREWING COMPANY is the first operational brewery in Ventura since the Ventura Brewery closed. It is located in what is known as the STRONG STEEL block. Around 1926 Courtland R. Strong moved his Chestnut Street blacksmith and welding business to a brick building which still exists on this site, covered over and lost to public view by building additions over the years. The business developed into the Strong Steel Corporation, and operated until 1967.

The Shields' vision was to use an existing industrial building in the downtown Ventura area for a brewery and pub. The search for a suitable building to renovate was not an easy one, as not many industrial buildings remain downtown. In fact, the Strong Steel block is at this time on the list for redevelopment (or demolition) by the City of Ventura.

Bob Shields and his wife, Trudy, have used the existing shell of the Strong Steel industrial structure to add charm to the brewery. The ceiling structure is original, and shows the steel beams once used to hoist heavy objects. The high windows enhance the 1930 industrial appeal.

The Shields Brewing Company, brewery and restaurant, was designed and built by Bob single handedly. He spent seven days a week for over one year in construction. The design of a California style pub and grill, offering public seating in full view of the brewing process (behind glass walls), was Bob's dream.

Central Coast Triumphs is a non-profit organization dedicated to the preservation and restoration of the Triumph automobile marque serving the Santa Barbara, Ventura and San Luis Obispo county areas. The club was established in 1983 and is a chapter of the Vintage Triumph Register. Members enjoy a variety of meetings, monthly activities and regalia. Dues are \$15.00 per year for those owning Triumphs and Associate Memberships are available for those not owning Triumphs, but are interested in the club, at \$9.00 per year. It is recommended that anyone interested in joining attend at least one meeting and/or activity. Meetings are held on the first Thursday of every month at 7:00 pm. These meetings are used for planning upcoming activities and as a forum to members for input into club organization and activities. Meetings are held at Bob's Big Boy on the corner of Ashwood and Telegraph in Ventura. Board meetings are held at the request of the President and are open to all club members with times and locations discussed at the general meetings.
