

The raffle prize of 7 quarts of oil was won by Steve Drury as the meeting was adjourned at $9:00\,\mathrm{pm}$.




TECH SESSION DETAILING YOUR TRIUMPH







You will not only learn a few of the detailing secrets but also find out how to set your car up for the three foot rule.



A few shots from the tech session at Wes Ketchams house last July. We did manage to get the engine attached to the transmission and lowered into the engine bay of his TR4A. The gang began to show at around 9:30 and proceeded to attached the clutch pieces to the flywheel. The transmission was eased into place and bolts tightened to ready it for the installation. Once placed upon the hoist, the car was rolled underneath and we began to lower away. One lesson was learned immediately which was that when you lengthen the boom on a hoist, be sure to lengthen the legs also as at one point the engine decided to take a nose dive. We were lucky to have enough people present to snag it before any contact with immovable objects was made. Lowering away, the unit was installed and the necessary attaching bolts were fixed for a permanent installation. With this ritual accomplished we all retired to the house for some barbqued hamburgers and all the fixings. We hope to see Wes' TR4A out and about in the near future. It will definitely be a show stopper. Many thanks go out to those members who attended and also to Wes and his wife for their hospitality.
