LETTER FROM THE EDITOR



The British car magazines advertise for nearly double that. If you look through the auto trader type magazines it is rare to find a TR listed, even Spitfires are now becoming scarce. This means that we will be experiencing the pitfalls of classic car ownership such as high insurance premiums, unwillingness to drive our cars as we used to, and lack of dismantled cars for parts. If you have a desire to own a particular TR model, it would be best to pick one up now and hold on to it such as we have done with our TR6. The six is in running condition and would make a nice show car with minimum work. We paid \$750.00 for it two years ago. I wouldn't be able to touch it now for that price.

Next on the agenda was the election of club President. Bob Klope nominated himself for this position and was voted in to the relief of everyone. One stipulation to his election was the need to change the monthly meeting dates to the first Tuesday of every month so Bob can attend the meetings. This change was made with no problem.






