

## **CRIUMPH-ANT CONTESTANTS**









attendance and will be again this year.



# Suitcase car

PHRRRRRRINGDINGDING! The 34-cc Zenoa 2-stroke belches a puff of blue smoke after a tug on its starter cord. I twist the throttle all the way home, and slowly, what came into this world as a standard Samsonite suitcase gathers speed. The full wrath of 1.7 horsepower is at my fingertips, and within minutes, I'm flat-out. The way I figure, O.J. Simpson in prime airport-sprinting form was good for brief surges to 17-18 mph, but this thing will run all day from baggage carousel to shuttle van at 12 mph.

Seriously (and how serious can you be about this thing?), the suitcase car was invented by Mazda powertrain engineer Yoshimi Kanemoto as part of a "fantasy day" contest that encourages employees to take a fresh look at transportation-sort of the design equivalent of a pop-off valve. Kanemoto's creation can be converted back into a standard-appearing suitcase in just one minute: By unlocking the steering column, the handlebars pivot down and the front wheel retracts; the rear wheels on stub axles are then removed and stored inside; finally, tubes inside the 2-piece ladder frame slide back, unlocking the frame and allowing the suitcase to be folded up and latched.

Its standard equipment is the envy of most other baggage, with a single lever-actuated disc brake, and fully operational headlights, brake lights and turn signals. Mouse-fur lining and a bulb-type air horn are the final, thoughtful touches. And it can still be

used as a suitcase (albeit a heavy one, at 70 lb.)-there's enough extra space inside for a shaving kit and a pair of socks.


