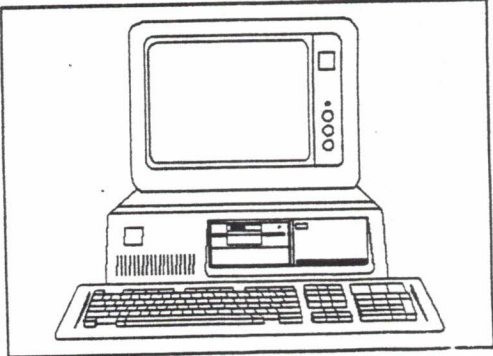
THE FLOOR WAS OPENED UP NEXT FOR GENERAL DISCUSSION AND COMMENTS.

EDIT . . . 'er, THAT'S ME !

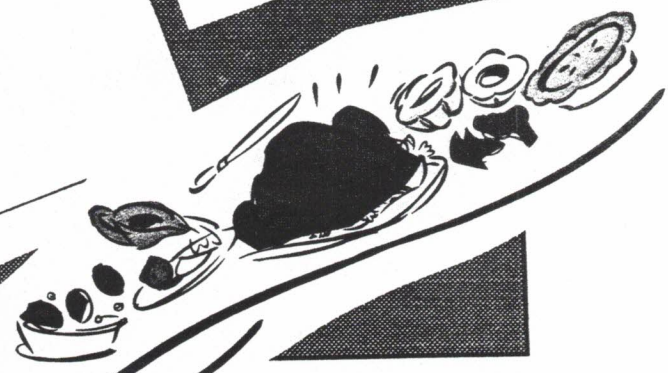

Spanners, Bonnets and boots. And bangers, of course. Such is the talk at any gathering of those dedicated to the preservation and enjoyment of vehicles from the land of double-decker buses, Charles and Di, and Lucas electrics. The San Fernando Valley's Woodley Park saw the rendezvous of more than 400 British-built vehicles on Sept. 24, and though many of the marques that were displayed are no longer made or brought to this country, you wouldn't know it by the enthusiasm of the Union Jack-waving crowd. The names you can still buy in the United States

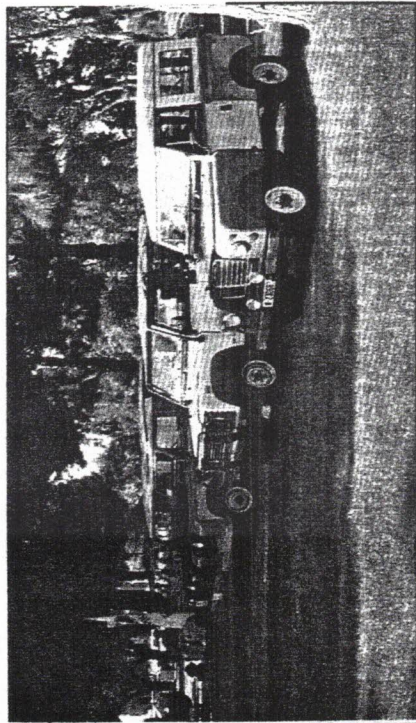
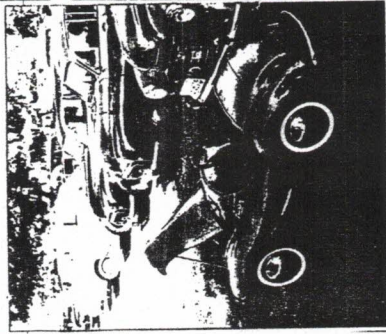
were there (Jaguar, Rolls-Royce, Bentley, Aston Martin, Morgan, Lotus), and the ones you can't turned out in force as well: Sunbeam, Triumph, MG, Alvis, Morris Minor, Mini, Marcos, not to mention the Vanden Plas Princess 3 Liter Mk II, and the Bentley-powered, alloy-bodied Playboy.

Lotus fans were abuzz at the debut of the new Elise (AW, Sept. 25). But most in attendance could not have cared less about latest model stuff. There were too many interesting old cars on the green.

Any idea how many different body styles were available on the basic Morris Minor? At least a dozen, based upon the display at Woodley Park. Several Aston

Martin DB5s and 6s drew admiring praise, as did a 1937 Rolls-Royce P3 V12, and just about every Mini on the grass. One of the more interesting displays was staged by Land Rover owners. While it's common to clean up one's machine prior to a concours, the Rover entries wore their dents, mud and dirt like badges of honor.

Vehicle Registration Issues

Item No. 1 Several of our members have asked about the provision in the vehicle code to exempt collector cars from the Planned Non-Operation (PNO) requirements. As you know, if you're not driving your car, you still must keep it registered, or you'll have to pay late registration penalties when you try to renew your registration. You can keep your car off the road long enough for the car to fall out of the DMV computer (4 years), but you'll have to have the serial numbers checked when you re-license it. A better way is to PNO your car. This costs \$5 per year.

There is an article in the vehicle code, article 4604(d)(3), which exempts collector vehicles from the PNO provisions. You can thank Jack Passey and the ACCC for that. Basically this is for cars 25 years old and older, although certain collector cars younger than that can qualify. 4604(d)(3) specifies what a collector car is. Basically a collector car is identified in sections 5004 and 5051. Not all 25+ year old cars are exempt. Lots of 25+ year old cars are daily drivers and are not exempt. You have to be a collector. To demonstrate this you simply tell the DMV that you are a collector. If they give you gas, you tell 'em you have X number of cars, and that you're insured with JC Taylor collector car insurance, and that you only drive your cars on club events, fund raisers, charity stuff, parades, etc. No problem.

So, now that you have decided that you aren't going to drive your collector car, and you don't want to license it, what do you do? You don't have to PNO it, but you may want to do that just to avoid the hassle you're going to get when trying to claim your exemption. After all, it's only 5 bucks. You may want to PNO it once every four years just to keep your records in the DMV computer. But if you decide you're going to take your exemption, this is what's going to happen. There's no special category to identify your car as a collector car. The DMV doesn't know your collector car from any other 30 year old beater that is driven daily. So they send you a renewal notice just like they do to everybody. You don't pay it because you know you're exempt. Great. Now the DMV sends you another notice. You ignore it too, 'cause you know you're right. Finally you get a letter from a collection agency, threatening all sorts of nasty things. They'll send two more letters from the collection agency if you don't do something. All normal procedure for the DMV. You have to take action to claim your exemption.

So here's what you should do. This comes straight from Janis Silver of the DMV office in Sacramento, who spoke at the ACCC Conference in April. Don't do anything until the first letter from the collection agency. Send that letter back with a note stating that your car is a collector car that is not being driven and it is not required

to be PNO'd per vehicle code section 4604(d)(3). *Don't send this notice back with the original renewal slip*, as it just gets treated as an orphan with the other 25 million or so renewals every year. You wait for the first collection notice. Each one of these gets reviewed individually when you send it back.

Item No. 2 I mentioned the nasty late renewal penalties above. I got nailed with this two years running for my Toyota. Nice car. Big penalties. Turns out that if the DMV doesn't send you a renewal notice, for whatever reason, they won't charge you the penalty. And they'll take your word for the fact that you didn't receive the notice. It's true. It's the official DMV policy. Janis Silver told me so, in person. Not only didn't I have to pay the penalty last year, but I applied for and received a refund for the year before too. There really are good people at the DMV.

Item No. 3 Engine swaps. The gentleman from the Bureau Of Automotive Repair was at the ACCC Conference in April, and he stated that pre-1966 cars are exempt from smog laws. Period. This means that you shouldn't have to smog a pre '66 car when it's sold. It also means that you can replace the engine in a pre '66 car with *any* engine, and you still don't have to meet any smog requirements. This is of particular interest to hot rodders, but it's good to know.
