
#### FYI







The Nut Behind the Wheel

I purchased my 1960 TR3A on April 1, 1984 - when I saw it I knew I had to have it. I may have paid a little too much for it, but on the other hand I drove it for 5 years before any major work had to be done. When I got the TR it had around 60,000 miles on it, and in the years since, I have put 210,000 miles on the car. It was a daily driver for most of those years and still made as many club functions as I could attend. I joined TRSC the week I got the car and CCT before the end of the month, and participated in my first event within weeks of taking the little beasty home. A few months later, without tools or spares, I attended my first Triumphest in Phoenix AZ.

I was the co-president of TRSC in 1985. We hosted Triumphest in Palm Desert that year. I have attended 12 Triumphest's since 1984 - never missing one. In 1986 I owned a Triumph repair/parts shop in Reseda called the Triumph Connection. Although it was short-lived, it was a great introduction to the mechanical end of this hobby for me.

Shortly after helping TRSC with Triumphest '89 in Lake Arrowhead, I relocated to Portland, Oregon, and joined the Portland Triumph Owners Association, attending all their events for the three years I was there and being elected as their president; however, I returned to Los Angeles before being able to serve. In 1990 I drove the TR from Portland to Boulder, Colorado, for the Vintage Triumph Register national convention, meeting up with a large contingent from Southern California. From 1989 to 1992 I put many miles on the TR between Los Angeles and Portland - the first in the snow of Thanksgiving '89 and the last in the heat of July '92.

I discovered a little piece of Triumph information that caught my interest and with the help of Marty Lodawer started a listing of Triumph build information, beginning with 300 TR2 and TR3/TR3A build records. Since that time I have collected build records and commission numbers from all over the country as well as from New Zealand and England. In 1993 I led a group of CCT and TRSC members to the VTR national in Seattle, Washington, and became the Vehicle Registrar for the convention. With the addition of the VTR membership listings to my build information, I now have data on 15,000 Triumphs. With this material I have written articles for the 4 Triumph clubs to which I belong and have contributed to Mr. Bill Piggott's recent book, "Triumph By Name - Triumph By Nature."

In 1995 I was again the president of TRSC. I now am the chairman of the Trimphest '96 committee, which is planning this year's Triumphest, to be held in Big Bear California in late September. I recently purchased a 1969 MGB GT, so the TR3A has been put in the garage to be used for enjoyment alone, and the GT will become my daily driver.

#### Mid-Life Crisis and the Sportscar

I grew up in the era that a sportscar was British or Italian and there were drawbacks. One had to forego such niceties as effective heater/defrosters, reliable drivetrains and reliable electrics. Air conditioning was unheard of.

If I had had real money back then, I would have been able to experience the reliability of a fully functional car. But as it was, my Healey was wounded but driveable. I was not able (that is, financially mature enough) to afford repairs. So I happily drove with a chipped first gear and an intermittent overdrive.

The peak (trough?) of my Austin Healey experience was a gorgeous, top down kind of day, driving enthusiastically on Decker Canyon road. Another fellow was doing the same thing coming in my direction. We met on a blind corner, both of us in a mild state of four wheel drift using the middle half of the road. I went wide and he pulled in tight, both cars straightening at just the right moment to pass, not crunch, and then pirouette behind each other. The dust slowly blew away as we looked at each other, grille facing grille at fifty paces, adrenaline pumping wildly. After a few long minutes, we waved and drove off, happy the only scraping was rubber tires.

The thrill of driving and the true feel of the machine never has left me. The tight response of quick steering, the grip of strong brakes on a light car and the push in the back from actual acceleration. Spirited motoring brought visions of Le Mans and Sebring at modest actual speeds. The imagination ran wild back then.

So after an extended hiatus, I have returned to the Sportscar. My previous desire for a car that would pull wheel stands on the freeway (427 Camaro) never materialized and I've finally tired of a bland driving experience (Mercedes Sedan). I wanted something fun again and bought it. Tight handling, powerful motor, AND air conditioning, power windows, electric sunroof, and , , and , even an electric-automatic rear spoiler!!! If I were still in high school, I would say 'to die for'.

Sorry to say it's not British, but I'm not sorry to say it satisfies the feeling that I want from the Sportscar Experience. I will admit that the idea of the car is worth something but isn't it true that it is the driving experience that actually bonds the club together? Does it really matter if the car is an "old" MGA or a "new" TR8? A Morris Cooper with a souped up 1098 or a stock Sprite?

The driving experience provided to the owner is the goal. The feel of it more than the specifications or the nameplate. The driving experience as communicated by firm ride, throaty exhaust, steering wheel feed-back and firm pedals. Driver, machine and the environment are ONE.






