

The meeting was adjourned at 8:20 p.m.



We applaud and wholeheartedly endorse your efforts to amend the recently enacted Smog Check II Program through legislation you are sponsoring, known as SB 42. This bill will exempt any car 25 years or older from the program regulations.



eports of problems with reformulated gasoline are reaching us with increasing frequency, in letters, phone calls, and in almost every automotive-related publication we see here at Moss Motors (and we do see a lot of different publications ranging from international magazines to local club newsletters). The mentioned problems include poor engine running characteristics, lower mileage, deterioration of rubber fuel system components, and severe health and safety risks. I will not dwell on the first two, as their effects on most cars seem to be minimal (although quite severe on some highmotorcycles). performance Reformulated gasoline also increases the amount of emissions of formaldehyde, acrolein, and acetaldehyde. Other dangerous substances produced are acetone, formic acid, and acetic acid.

departments from Fire Francisco to Long Island report a noticeable increase in vehicle fires since the introduction of reformulated gasoline. Although the evidence is mostly destroyed in the fires, fuel leaks are reportedly a major cause. Chevron and other oil companies have confirmed that the oxygenate MTBE (methyl tertiary butyl ether) may damage fuel system parts in older high-mileage cars. The fact is that MTBE is causing fuel leaks by drying up and rotting rubber fuel system components, which leads to dangerous fuel leaks. Mechanics and fleet owners report having to replace gas lines, seals, fuel pumps, and carburetor diaphragms much more often than prior to the introduction of MTBE in gasoline. Harley-Davidson has recalled 176,000 1994-'96 motorcycles for replacement of a fuel valve diaphragm which they say can be damaged by MTBE. Failure of wettedtype fuel injectors in automobiles due to reformulated gasoline has been admitted by the U.S. Environmental

## Is Reformulated Gas Dangerous?

Protection Agency (EPA). This stuff is causing problems!

Reports on the health hazards of MTBE are rapidly multiplying, and medical researchers are looking into several aspects of not only the inherent toxicity of MTBE itself, but also toxins produced when MTBE is burned in an engine. Automobile emissions testing checks levels of "obvious" exhaust components: unburned hydrocarbons, carbon monoxide, and oxides of nitrogen. What are not looked for are less obvious but even more dangerous by-products of burning MTBE in gasoline, such as formaldehyde and TBF (tertiary butyl formate, said to be 10,000 times more irritating than other hydrocarbons in gasoline exhaust, and of which "inhalation can be fatal"). Research by Dr. Peter M. Joseph (Professor of Radiologic Physics in Radiology, Pennsylvania, of University Philadelphia) has shown that since the introduction of MTBE, at least six diseases have become exacerbated in Philadelphia: asthma up 44%, nasal allergy up 48%, conjunctivitis up 67%, ear infection up 48%, sinusitis up 70%, and trouble breathing up 131%! He suspects TBF as the main culprit. In 1995, Dr. Nachman Brautbar (an internist practicing in Los Angeles, and affiliated with the University of Southern California School of Medicine) linked MTBE use in gasoline to immune system problems, such as a reduction in the ability of the immune system to fight invader cells, and noted that breakdown products of MTBE such as formaldehyde produced irritation and sensitization of the immune system. Symptoms included headaches, shortness of breath, sinus problems, and skin rashes. He also noted a preliminary observation suggesting a mechanism for the carcinogenic effects of MTBE.

Massive complaints of people getting sick from MTBE-bearing gasoline in Fairbanks and Anchorage, Alaska in 1992 prompted the Alaska Department of Health to investigate, with the conclusion that the new gasoline was to blame. Alaska banned MTBE in fuels, and there were no further such complaints. At the same time in Missoula, Montana, there was a sudden dramatic increase in asthma cases. When the oxygenate was switched from MTBE to ethanol, the unusual health problems did not recur.

MTBE ground water contamination has become a major concern in many areas. The U.S. EPA classes MTBE as a "possible" carcinogen. The Sacramento Bee reported in a July 6,

1996 article that MTBE contamination outstripped the ability of Santa Monica, California to treat its water supply, and forced the shut-down of five wells which supplied half the needs of 200,000 people. This forced the importation of water, at nearly twice the cost of local water. MTBE ground water contamination has been reported in California, Nevada, Georgia, Texas, New Mexico, Colorado, New York, and Pennsylvania to name but a few states!

The main intent of MTBE in gasoline is to reduce carbon monoxide emissions. The National Research Council in June, 1996 published the results of a study on MTBE use which showed the actual reductions in carbon monoxide to be much less than the 20% figure bandied about by MTBE proponents, even to the point of suggesting the net environmental reduction may be zero. They concluded that "data are not available to evaluate the effectiveness of the (MTBE) program". In other words, this group of respected scientists could not find any evidence of benefits from MTBE use. Our "cleanerburning" reformulated gasoline does produce increased levels of highly toxic substances, and is playing at best an insignificant role in reducing urban pollution. With zero to low benefits, but high health and safety risks, I venture to suggest that MTBE is causing more problems than it was supposed to solve.

#### **PASSING SMOG**

A commonly asked question these days is, "How can I get my car to pass its emissions test?". A few tips have kindly been supplied by Ken Gillanders of British Frame & Engine. Although specifically for TR250/TR6, the principles apply generally.

1. Change oil using 20W-50W.

2. Use new spark plugs, gapped to 0.032" (standard is 0.025").

- 3. Use new solid-core ignition wire (not carbon core wire).
- 4. Loosen valve clearances .005" from standard.
- Ensure all smog equipment is present and working properly.
- 6. Retard ignition timing about 3
- Adjust carbs lean—engine should die when carb piston lifted  $\frac{1}{32}$ "- $\frac{1}{16}$ ".

8. Ensure that the engine is at full operating temperature for the test.

9. Use low-restriction air filters—wire mesh types are great for this.

10. Run your fuel level down as far as possible and refill just before the test.

#### PROTON ACQUIRES LOTUS

alaysian car manufacturer Proton has acquired a controlling interest in Lotus. At the end of October, Perusahaan Otomobil Nasional Berhad took over the British sports car maker from ACBN Holdings S.A. Luxembourg for a total cash consideration of £51 million.

Proton is currently planning to extend its product range and capabilities in order to continue competing in world markets. It is felt that the acquisition will enable the company to draw from Lotus' famed engineering and R&D capabilities at the same time as injecting resources into the U.K. firm. Proton was already one of the many companies to have already benefited from Lotus engineering.

Lotus' future has for some time been uncertain under the ownership of Romano Artioli. Against this it has recently introduced, to rave reviews, the Elise, the first car of its kind to use an extruded aluminum and bonded chassis. Now, rather than merely survive, it is hoping to use the Proton backing to make new inroads into markets such as North America.

Said Tan Sri Yahaya Ahmad, chairman of Proton's parent company, DRB-Hicom, "We see our strong partnership in a very positive light, mutually benefiting from both Lotus and Proton. In concluding the deal, both companies are aware that we can draw from each other's strengths to make

us more competitive."

The merger of the British and U.S. companies, Lucas and Varity, which took place in the Fall, has created a genuine global systems supplier. It has also presented opportunities to make some changes in the way each of the companies had been struc.. Walt

tured. Lucas Varity, as it is now known, is being organized into seven divisions.

Encompassed are light vehicle braking systems, heavy vehicle braking systems, diesel systems, diesel engine, electrical and electronic systems and aftermarket operations as well as aerospace.
