# President's Letter



The Clear Hooter May 2012 Presidents Letter

So, it's just after mid summer's day. Well, according to Shakespeare and his Mid Summer Nights Dream anyway. W are halfway through the year and well on the way to being ready for our annual CCBCC Car Show on July 22nd. We held our June monthly club meeting on June 5. Attendance was quite light but we have to expect that in the summer. At the meeting I asked for ideas for a venue for our Monthly Breakfast this month and suggested that we could try the Sheraton Four Points Hotel despite the unfortunate experience we had there once before. Everyone agreed to give them another chance. So, on June 16th twelve of us went over to Sheraton Four Points Hotel and we had a really nice breakfast and a fun time. The food was good and hot and the servers were attentive. I think we should do that again.

In my last monthly letter I recalled the history of the MG 'B' but I wonder how many of us know the history of the MG Car Company? I thought that I would look into that this month. Last month I mentioned that in 1923, a dealership for The Morris Car Company (named 'Morris Garage) started to rebuild the bodywork on some Morris cars. Using their own initials, they called them MG's. I have recently come across information that said that a certain Cecil Kimber was a Director of Morris Cars Ltd who left the company to start his own line of cars. He called them MG, using the initials of Morris Garage, which was another business that he owned but it all leads to the same thing.

While MG have always been known for sporty cars it has not always been Two Seater Sports Cars. In the early days they made very large grand Saloons like the 1939 WA 2.6 Litre Sports Saloon - before that: the 14/40, the 18/80, the 1933 Magnette K-Series and the original Midget. In 1936 this lead to the development of the MG 'T' Series, although by this time the company had been sold to the Nuffield Group of Companies. The 'T' Series started out with the 'TA' this was an open two seater, body-on-frame, Sports Car with a 1292cc OHV engine with twin SU carburetors and developed, after WWII, through the 'TB', 'TC', 'TD' and finally the 'TF' which was replaced in 1955 by the MG 'A' model which was a totally new design. This was a longer, wider, lower design than the 'T's', again body- on- frame but produced as either an Open Tourer or a Coupe with a completely new 1500cc engine. The British Motor Corporation owned the company by this time. They built over 100,000 of these cars before, in 1962, developing the famed MG 'B' which I told you all about last month, and continued production until the business closed down in 1980. I believe that the business or at least the 'MG' part of it is now owned by some Chinese interests and, when in the UK, I have seen some recent sporty little saloon models but I know that they closed down again and whether they restarted again, a second time is not clear.

The year 2012 also represents the 50th Anniversary of the 'Spitfire'. No, the Triumph Spitfire not the Supermarine Spitfire, that's much older. So I thought next month we might take a look at the history of the Spitfire.



In a collaboration with bike company Factor Bikes, Aston Martin has designed a limited edition 'superbike' called the 'One-77 Cycle'—that has been given the

Dubbed as 'the world's most technologically advanced road bicycle' by the company, the bicycle features a data logging system that provides over '100 channels of performance feedback' such as crank torque, leg power and crank force for both legs.


It is also able to provide other measurements such as acceleration, wasted leg power and rear wheel speed, and the traditional measurements like speed, heart rate and GPS location.

The One-77 Cycle is made with a carbon frame—that can be painted in seven exclusive Aston Martin colors—with 'hand-stitched' saddle and handlebars reflecting Aston Martin's elegant craftsmanship.

However, just like the car, the One-77 Cycle does not come cheap—it cost around US\$39,000 for one bicycle—with only 77 such bikes being made.








