



# TyreSafe's 'Magnificent 7' Tyre Safety Tips

- Make sure your tyres have adequate tread depth to keep you safe and legal by taking the 20p test
- Ensure your tyres are properly inflated and checked at least once a month and before any long journeys
- Check the condition of your tyres by looking for any lumps, bulges or cracks and remove any objects embedded in the tread
- When checking the tread, pressures and condition, don't forget the spare
- Consider fitting winter weather tyres for the whole winter period. At temperatures below 7 degrees C they provide much better safety and grip
- Remove wheels or jack the weight off any vehicles' tyres that will not be used over the winter months such as caravans, horseboxes or motorcycles
- Visit your nearest participating tyre dealer for a free tyre safety check






# Pebble Beggh

The third weekend in August has been the date for the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance for 61 years. Car week has grown over the years to include several other events but Pebble Beach still rules them all.

The Concorso Italiano (the all- Italian show that takes place on Friday) featured an enormous collection of lesser Ferraris, but this year at Pebble Beach, the vast majority of the world's surviving Ferrari GTOs were present. That was really a sight to be seen. The day before, I saw several of them going around the track at speed over at Laguna Seca.

You simply can't see a collection of cars of this caliber anywhere else on the globe. Car and Driver named Pebble Beach one of their 10 automotive events to see before you die, and I think they definitely have that right. This year the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance featured Mercedes-Benz, Stutz, Rolls-Royce Silver Ghosts, Ferrari 250 GTO, and Italian motorcycles. This year's event drew vehicles from 27 states and 14 countries (plus Monaco). Featured vehicles included the Ferrari F250 GTO with 22 on display, not to mention the Jaguar E-Type and a special display by Mercedes-Benz highlighting 125 year of the automobile.

But perhaps what makes Pebble Beach so special are the true rarities. There were several amazing cars on display with names I had never seen before.

There is so much happening that it is really difficult to take it in everything. Everyone receives a program which contains brief descriptions of the cars. What I discovered is that there is a lot more to the stories behind a lot of the cars. A great resource for more info I found was on Jay Leno's website, www.jaylenosgarage.com. He conducted interviews with several of the owners of the cars who gave in-depth accounts on features of the cars, history, started them up, etc. Each feature is a video around 10 minutes in length or less. I highly recommend checking it out.

Another interesting part of the show is the people watching. There were quite a few women wearing their Sunday bonnets, men and women in fancy period dress, and a few "fashion victims" that were good for a smile.

I didn't stay for the entire awards show. I didn't think it was possible but I was reaching the saturation point with cars, crowds, and sun. Art Center College of Design in Pasadena, CA held its annual Car Classic car show last month. The event has become a must-attend on my calendar for the past few years. Being an Art Center alum, it also makes for a good excuse to visit my old stomping grounds. While rain hampered last year's Car Classic, this year's event benefited from a very warm for October, Southern California day.

The theme for this year's event was "California Design: Influencing Change," meaning that in addition to enjoying all the classic cars on display—including a 1968 Peter Brock Triumph TR 250 K; a 1942 Alfa Romeo 6C 2500 SS Berlinetta Aero Dynamica; and a 1932 Doane Spencer Hot Rod—visitors to Car Classic learned about the continuing global influence that Southern California has on transportation design. Anyone from Art Center will tell you that the Car Classic is not a concours event, but rather a display of automotive art. As a result, the selection of cars is fairly eclectic and the vehicles are strewn about the campus lawn in a rather unorganized fashion. While the layout may not be as photogenic, it makes it easy to wander through the sea of cars and simply enjoy each and every one.

Each Car Classic does have a theme, though, and for 2011 the event celebrated Southern California's influence on automotive design. In addition to Art Center producing some of the world's most famous automotive designers, more than twenty advanced automotive design studios call the area home, several of which brought recent concept cars to display. There were also special displays for California hot rods and California beach culture as well as cars designed by Peter Brock. The Petersen Automotive Museum and Mullin Museum also brought out cars from their impressive collections.

Throughout the day, panel discussions were held to


hear influential and innovative designers speak about the influence California culture has had on their work. This year, panel discussions ranged from the topic of California Vehicle Design Studios, an unveiling of the ICON 4 x 4, California Hot Rods, California Beach Culture, to California Motor Sports.

Special guests at this weekend's event included a number of Art Center alumni, including: Peter Brock, founder of Brock Racing Enterprises and designer of the Cobra Daytona Coupe; Chip Foose, president and CEO of Foose Design and member of the Hot Rod Hall of Fame; Chuck Pelly, founder of The Design Academy Inc. and BMW DesignworksUSA; and Freeman Thomas, director of strategic design for Ford Motor Company.

Also present at the event was alumnus Miguel Galluzzi, the designer of the legendary Ducati Monster motorcycle and Vice President of Design at Piaggio. Other guests to the event included: Bruce Canepa, Porsche racer and owner of Canepa Design; Dave Kunz, automotive reporter for KABC-TV Los Angeles; Barry Meguiar, president and CEO, Meguiar's Inc. and host of SPEED Channel's Car Crazy; Bruce Meyer, car collector and former chairman of the Petersen Automotive Museum; and Bruce Meyers (Meyers Manx), father of the modern dune buggy.







Everybody knows Peter Brock for a different reason. To historic Corvette fans he's the guy who penned the lines of the original Sting Ray racer and by extension the '63 Corvette "split window". To Cobra fans meanwhile, Peter's the guy who took the brick-like Shelby Cobra roadster and turned it into the slippery Cobra Daytona Coupe – the first American car to grab the FIA's GT World Championship. Datsun devotees love to remember the Peter Brock of Brock Racing Enterprises during the late '60s and early '70s; that fun-loving hipster who coolly called the shots as BRE's 510 coupes decimated the Alfas and Porsches of the Trans-Am 2.5 series.

Brock left Shelby in 1965 after the company came bogged down under the corporate influence of Ford. He then did a variety of jobs, including setting up his own enterprise Brock Racing Enterprises BRE's first task was developing the Hino Contessa for Californian Club racing and also designed a prototype for Triumph, the TR250K. That car was also on display at the Art Center show.

The 250K was aluminium-bodied with an electronically adjustable rear wing. The car used Triumph mechanicals, and was built for Kaz Kastener's team of factory backed Triumphs. It used side-draft Webers as throttle bodies for mechanical fuel injection on the 2.5 Triumph straight 6. The car led Sebring for three hours before the clutch broke. The 25<sup>th</sup> annual Santa Barbara Concours d'Elegance, held at the Santa Barbara Polo & Racquet Club, displayed some of the world's finest automobiles and motorcycles. This year's Concours featured Marque manufacturer Mercedes Benz, Grand Marshal Andy Granatelli, Master of Ceremonies Ed Lucas, and the 35<sup>th</sup> anniversary reunion of Clénet Coachworks.

The Mille Miglia North America Tribute was held in advance of the 25<sup>th</sup> Annual Santa Barbara Concours d'Elegance. The 1,000 mile experience was produced in the spirit of the original Mille Miglia in Italy, on a picturesque California coast route running through the remarkable landscapes of Santa Barbara, Carmel, San Francisco, and Monterey.

The show took place over 2 days with Saturday featuring a car corral for car clubs and the main event on Sunday. Car Corral areas were set up surrounding the main field and every effort was made to align club cars with their respective manufacturer within the judged show field. Many CCBCC members met up early Saturday morning for a caravan up to Carpinteria for the event.

Concours d'Elegance Grand Marshall, "Mr. Indy 500" Andy Granatelli, said the event was a success."It's a wonderful day, a great crowd," Mr. Granatelli told the News-Press. "It's the premiere event now. A lot of people, a lot of cars, a good day (and) the location in beautiful Santa Barbara. What else could you ask for?"

Entries to date come from from Westlake Village, Santa Ynez, Nipomo, Oxnard, Ventura, Carpinteria, Montecito and Santa Barbara. Other entries come from Hermosa Beach, Burbank, Grass Valley, Valencia and Arizona. The Mullin Museum in Oxnard entered a 1939 Delahaye Type 165 Cabriolet, while the Petersen Automotive Museum in Los Angeles brought a 1939 Bugatti Type 57C Van Vooren Cabriolet.

Local, national, and international wineries gather for the 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Vino d'Elegance, a tasting and celebration at the height of the harvest season. This event benefits the local community and creates an exquisite Santa Barbara weekend spotlighting participating wineries.

Throughout the event, winners of various awards were announced, culminating in the final, Best-in-Show award. There were many classes so there were plenty of awards to go around. The long wheelbase 1936 Delahaye 135 Competition Disappearing Top Convertible by Figoni et Filachi won "Best of Show". 


