and painted, fooling him into thinking it was a good car. Subsequently, he took the car apart and began working. Unfortunately, he only made things worse by welding heavy steel plates on the wings, doors, etc. warping most of the sheet metal. Eventually, he gave up, and the car sat for years in hundreds of pieces. Blindly, I went ahead and made an offer.

After a deal was done, I arranged to have the car shipped to our home in Seattle. Even though I paid extra since the car was disassembled, when the car arrived, the transport driver and his wife were not happy. There were dozens upon dozens of boxes, one large cardboard carton filled to the brim with unmarked parts, a loose body in three separate pieces, a loose engine and transmission, and a rolling frame. In a huff, the driver spread out the remains of the car in my driveway, as heavy rain made things even more uncomfortable. It was then that my wife asked, "You paid how much for this?"

When the rain eased, I gathered up my treasure and put it into my shop. The first activity was to get the engine to a machine shop for rebuild, knowing it would be months before I got it back. I put the body aside, and concentrated on the chassis work. After several months, I had a refurbished chassis. Upon the return of the engine, I rigged a way to start the engine in the bare chassis. Ready or not, I started the engine. It's alive!!! What a great day.

Looming ahead of me was the reconstruction of the body. Over a period of two years I purchased and installed new and used sheet metal to repair the rusted sections. The most difficult task was determining exactly how and where things fit together. The center section of the body was nearly all gone, and the front and rear clip severely rusted. The position of the A and B pillars, the cowl, the front and rear clip to the new sills would determine if the doors would close properly, or if the hood would fit. I did a lot of guessing, fitting and refitting. Only after all was repaired did I move on to painting. Painting the body was a huge project in of itself.

The next year of work on the car was a series of projects to finish the car. Expensive items such as the interior kit, the chrome pieces, and glass were purchased over time. Challenges such as installing all new wiring kept me humbled. Finally, in late 2002, the car was done. I remember a grade school teacher once told me that I could be a good student if I just would focus and stick to it. Maybe, I just needed a Jaguar roadster as the object of my focus.
