My TR4 Story by Bob Muzio continued from cover page

This is my third TR 4. One might conclude that it's my favorite Triumph and they'd be correct. I like the upright "classic" car look, coupled with some modern amenities.

The roll up windows and the fresh air vents for example. I like the solid rear axle, less complex. My first TR4, an early powder blue one (TR3 seats, no trunk TR4 emblem) was purchased in the mid 60's from a Grumman Aircraft engineer when I lived on Long Island, NY. In the 60's Long Island was a hotbed of sports car activity. TSD rallies, gymkhanas, owners of all marques waving and honking at one another. Yes, a young man just had to have a sports car. I moved to Los Angeles in '67 with my new bride. Yes, I drove the TR, no problems at all in the journey. Probably a good thing being newly married. After braving many NY winters the TR was starting to turn to brown dust and it was replaced by a 356B Porsche.

In 1999 I had the itch for a vintage sports car and so a suitable TR4 was acquired. It wasn't easy as this was before the plethora of sites on the internet. I traveled to many Triumphests and shows, won many accolades, and was cherished. TR4 number 2 was an "Arrest Me Red" '64 which, though restored by the previous owner, enjoyed some upgrades after I acquired it that enhanced it both cosmetically and technically. Sadly in 2010, on the way to Triumphest in San Diego we were rear ended by a full sized Lexus and in turn, rear ended a full sized Toyota on the 405 in Long Beach. It was a "total" but it was tough. The driver/passenger area maintained its integrity. The doors wouldn't open and the windows wouldn't roll down but it did protect the occupant.

I sourced my current TR4 from an ad in Hemmings Motor News. It was a Triumph Racing Green '62 with a biscuit interior and a burl walnut dashboard. It was located just north of San Diego, only had 3600 miles on a ten year old restoration from an established shop in El Cajon, and was a trophy winner at the Fairbrook Farms show for three years running. I spoke to the restorer, a San Diego Triumph club member, the owner, and arranged a meet up. Bob Jasper accompanied me and we drove the car. I then cut a deal with the owner. Hence, TR4 number 3.

Meanwhile, I bought the salvage of number 2 from the insurance company for next to nothing. The goodies from number 2 (chrome 72 spoke wire wheels, chrome SU air filters, late TR4 seats, overdrive transmission, wood Moto Lita steering wheel, alternator, and more), soon found their way onto number 3. Additional items added were a new grill, a Revington TR badge/light bar, and driving lamps. TR4 number 3 has lived up to the standards of my previous TRs. Award winner, show winner, reliable driving machine, a head turner and performer if there ever was one. As you might conclude I've strived to enhance my rides both cosmetically and mechanically. I've put my "stamp" on them. I hope you approve.

MG 2020 Update

Progress continues in preparation for NAMG-BR's Annual Convention in Calgary next summer, the host Calgary MG Car Club working diligently to assemble a menu of interesting and varied activities and tours. By the time you read this, www.MG2020.org will be online and taking registrations, so head on over there to check out the program and get yourself registered.

The host hotel is the Deerfoot Inn and Casino, deep in the south end of Calgary at 11500 - 35 St S.E., at the junction of Alberta Hwy2 and Barlow Trail. You must register through www.MG2020.org to receive the discounted convention room rate. Your registration e-mail confirmation will include your hotel "booking code" which allows you to book at the hotel's guaranteed lowest rate.

Calgary is a large center by western Canadian standards, with a population of 1.3 million. It is Canada's "Oil Capital" as well as a major business center, though it has not shaken its "Cowntown" moniker. A nod to its roots as the center of the vast livestock rearing areas of the Province, and home

to the world-famous Calgary Stampede which starts its 10-day run immediately following MG 2020.

Major attractions within the city include the Calgary Zoo, Glenbow Museum, Calgary Tower, Heritage Park Historical Village and WinSport Canada Olympic Park on the western edge of the city. The city has a vast network of paved pathways for walking/biking, converging on the downtown core from all quadrants with Princes Island, the Peace Bridge and Eau Claire being the focal points there. The area offers a surprisingly leisurely way to enjoy views of the city's core and its wide variety of entertainment and dining, particularly after offices close for the day and nightlife gets underway. Bike and scooter rentals are available in the core, and there are also guided Segway and motorcycle-sidecar tours offered by independent operators. Information will be available at registration.

For socializing, we are planning a Sunday night reception at the hotel, and an offsite catered event a short drive from the hotel on Monday evening. On Tuesday evening we will

leave you to your own devices, to explore our vibrant city and its endless choices of activities and places to kick back and relax. Enjoy a leisurely walk alongside the Bow River downtown, or along the pedestrianized 8th Avenue to explore shops and restaurant patios. The trendy Inglewood district east of downtown on 9th Avenue offers more choices for shopping and food/drink experiences, as does Kensington just across the river and to the west of the core. Or, of course, the restaurants, bars, and casino right at the hotel give you ample choices to visit and kick back or revel with other MG folks without having to venture anywhere.

If you want to get out of the city to enjoy the amazing vistas of the Rocky Mountain foothills, quiet roads and interesting stops abound.

A number of self-guided tours with directions and maps will be available at registration. Areas to the south and west of the city are easily accessible from the hotel with minimal "freeway" driving to start. Small towns/villages offer a variety of attractions, shopping and dining. High River, only 30 minutes away, will be familiar to fans of the popular TV series (in Canada at least) "Heartland". A further 30 minutes south is the town of Nanton, home to The Bomber Command Museum of Canada, which houses a restored (though not flyable) Lancaster aircraft which you can take a tour of.

Canada's mountain National Parks are tantalizingly close to the west, and bus tours from the hotel to Banff are planned. We are suggesting folks take advantage of these tours, rather than driving out, as parking can be an issue during the very busy summer season.

CCBCC Annual Wine Tour

The **2020 CCBCC Wine Tour** will take place Friday night **February 21st** (check-in and socialize), Saturday **February 22nd** (back-roads drive, winery tours, and evening social/pot-luck), and Sunday **February 23rd** (check-out and drive home).

On Saturday the 22nd, as a group we'll line up the cars in the hotel's parking lot and depart the hotel to make a couple of stops in the morning and continue on back roads to our lunch venue.

For those of you that are new to the club, or to this event, the day of the tour (Saturday) works like this:

- you grab breakfast prior to our departure (breakfast is included if you're staying at The Cottage Inn).
- you bring a picnic lunch to our lunch venue/stop (I'm trying to find a place that also offers food such as pizza or a food truck like last year).
- in the evening we have a potluck style dinner in the hotel's dining area, so you will bring something to share with the group. Plates, napkins and silverware are provided. It's very low key and casual, and we socialize before, during and after dinner, usually over glasses of the wine that we've picked up throughout the day. We even have our traditional "Julie Time" raffle!

The hotel that this event takes place at is **The Cottage Inn by the Sea** in Pismo Beach. There is a block of (25) discounted hotel rooms set up for us already. You are not obligated to stay at The Cottage Inn, but that's where we have our block of rooms, and they let the CCBCC use their dining room free of charge for our Saturday night gathering.

Our discounted rates this year are \$179/nt. for a std. King room, and \$239/nt. for a ground floor ocean front King room (plus tax, license, and doc fees). These rates are much lower than we've seen in past years!

If you're going to stay at the Cottage Inn, **you need to call the Cottage Inn and book/pay for your room**. Reference the '**CCBCC block**'. The cut-off date for our discounted block of rooms is January 31, 2020, but when they're all booked they are gone! The Cottage Inn's number is **(805) 773-4617**. If you have questions or any problems making a reservation, just email, call or text me.

This is a fantastic hotel that sits on the bluffs above the Pacific Ocean in Pismo Beach, CA. A few of the amenities this hotel offers that keeps our club coming back year after year are:

- Quaint Old English cottage style architecture
- Free onsite guest parking
- Oceanfront, heated pool and spa (Complementary robes in each room)
- Complementary daily continental breakfast
- Fireplaces in every room
- Oceanfront fire pits and Adirondack chairs with ocean views along the bluffs
- Mini fridge, microwave, and coffee makers in each room
- Beach access
- 10-minute walk to pier and downtown Pismo
