# PRESIDENTS MESSAGE—Urgent



The elections are coming up in December, where we elect the board members. Normally I would not be talking about the elections this early, but this year is a different situation. There are two positions where the incumbent is not seeking re-election and we desperately need to fill these positions. The club recorder and President are both open positions that we need to fill. The club cannot function unless we fill these two positions. I cannot emphasize this enough.

The club recorder position is a one-year term and entails taking minutes at the club meetings and events. There is a form to fill out for this and it really does not take up much time. This position has voting rights and you must attend the general and board meetings. The board meetings are done remotely over Skype once a month. In case you are wondering, we need to record our meeting minutes to conform to the club by laws. Our by-laws allow us to be a nonprofit club registered with the state and federal government.

The President position is two-year term and entails making sure the club runs smoothly. This includes running the monthly board and general meetings, working with the board, and ensuring the club adheres to the by-laws.

I have been the President of the club for the last 5-1/2 years and have really enjoyed doing this job. When Jim Hill approached me about running for President, I was very apprehensive about it. I thought about it for weeks and finally decided that someone needed to do it, or the club may not exist. I am very glad I made the decision to run. I have gotten to work with some fantastic people and made lots of friends during this time. It has been very enjoyable time for me being club President.

If you are thinking about either of these positions, please keep in mind that you will not be alone and you will have help. Our current recorder Martin Keller will be available for questions and the other board members will help as well. For the President position I will remain as the President's advisor and will be available for any questions or guidance.

We are also creating a new position in the club for an Assistant Treasurer. Chris Vujea is our Treasurer now. Next year she will be doing a lot of traveling. This means she will not be able to do some of the local duties. We are looking for someone to volunteer to pick up the mail a couple times a week in Ventura, make bank deposits when we get checks, and attend the board meetings remotely. In Chris's absence this position will get a vote in the board meetings. For this position you do not need any bookkeeping knowledge.

To keep the club going we will need some members to volunteer for these positions. Please contact me if you have any questions or are interested in any of the positions.


We will also be electing a new recorder as the present recorder will be stepping down due to work commitments and travel.






