It's time to start thinking about Drive Your Triumph Day, Friday, February 10, 2023.

My name is Rye Livingston and I'm with the Triumph Travelers Sports Car Club in Northern California, arguably the longest active Triumph Club in the world, founded in 1958.

In 2016 I encouraged members of our club to drive their Triumphs on February 10th, to celebrate Sir John Black's Birthday, the man who organized Standard's purchase of Triumph after WW II, and went on to make the cars we enjoy driving today.

Drive Your Triumph Day has gained momentum every year, and last year I received over 600 photos from all over the world: Scotland, Ireland, the UK, New Zealand, Australia, South Africa, Uruguay, Netherlands, Switzerland, Finland, Canada, Holland, Czech Republic, and of course all over the USA. I'm hoping we can increase that number again this year!

The concept is straightforward. On February 10th, go for a drive in your Triumph. Take a scenic drive on a country road or out to lunch, to the market, to work, wherever. Go for a drive alone or in a big group with your local Triumph Club. Take your spouse, buddy, child, grandchild or your dog; then take a photo. The photo is mainly of the car, and the owner or passenger if possible, ideally in front of a cool spot, landmark, scenic view or in your driveway. If it's the middle of the winter where you live and your car is in hibernation, or in the middle of a restoration, take a photo of it in the garage. Have fun with it.

Next step is to email a high-resolution photo to driveyourtriumphday@gmail.com, along with some basic information: owner's name, year and model of car, and place photo was taken (city, state, country). The photos will then be published not only in our club newsletter, but also in USA's national magazine: Vintage Triumph Registry, and on the Drive Your Triumph Day website: https://driveyourtriumphday.shutterfly.com



My First British Car by Eric Baldwin

They say you'll never forget your first. It's true, but it wasn't that great. As a matter of fact, it was pretty awful.


The year was 1984, not the first time I read George Orwell, but the actual year. This was in Seattle, I was 22 and after a steady diet of American Muscle cars since I got my license on my 16th birthday (first in line that morning), I happened upon my first British car; it was a roach. A very tired 1973 MGB came haphazardly into my life (a story for another day). It was white with a black interior and a very leaky black soft top, remember this is Seattle. The paint was passable and would shine with some work (which I gave it), the interior was in good shape and I loved having gauges for the first time in a car. What a novelty: a tach, oil pressure, temperature and fuel gauges! I knew so much about what was going on under the hood besides the obvious mechanical cacophony, leaks and electrical failures. The seed was planted.

Being 22, and thus immortal, very confident in my mechanical ability and having few worries in life, the MGB and I took quite a few trips of over 100 miles; sometimes we would make it, sometimes not; it was all part of the experience and the uninitiated had no idea what an adventure a 20-mile drive could be. Sometimes I would attempt to revel them with stories of great adventure and they would just shake their heads and get back in their Toyotas or Hondas and be on their way; blissfully unaware of the excitement and fulfillment of the journey. One time I drove it to my Grandmother's farm, which was about 175 miles away, and made it there only to breakdown on a trip about 10 miles away while seeing a friend who lived in the area. I had to hitchhike home, but I didn't tell my Grandma who would have been appalled; I lied and told her I was going to catch the bus. The MGB sat there in her front yard for about a month (she had 80 acres) until I could get the money up to fix it. Of course, I hitched a ride back with parts and tools in hand and made the repairs in the tall grass. Remember, this is 1984 and I'm a big guy, so I didn't even have an inkling of concern for my safety or any fear of what might happen along the way; it was still in the hangover of the '70's and times were simpler. Today, I wouldn't drive it outside of my neighborhood and hitchhiking is for those with a death wish.

I did manage to get the MGB back to Seattle in the spring of '84 and I was about to graduate from Seattle Community College. I spent a lot of time in the weight room then (I do have pictures) and one of the other people in the weight room was a young woman named Amanda. There were springtime events at the college, an annual ritual acknowledging the first sighting of the sun for months (again, Seattle), and a bodybuilding contest was one that we both entered. Short version here: she won and I got second place. Hot Tubs for two was the grand prize, but there was no second prize. Ultimately, of course, we were both winners as we've been married now for almost 38 years.

Back to the MGB, it might have been our second date and maybe the second time she road in the car, and we were out with some friends and one asked to try and drive it, drinking was definitely involved and there was no prior experience with a clutch... As you might guess, the clutch was dumped and promptly gave up the ghost. That was the last time my MGB moved under its own power, all I had was a bicycle to get around on and a new girlfriend who wondered what kind of loser she was involved with.

The story does have a happy ending though: I did get two loves: the love of my life and one with British cars.

Annual Report by the Treasurer for Central Coast British Car Club, Inc. for FY 2022

Club Activities

Individual members of CCBCC agree to coordinate various events and activities throughout the year. This includes breakfast runs, museum visits, the wine tours, and other motoring events.

Most of these activities are "at cost" to the members who participate, and are not generally subsidized by the Club.

Due to continuing COVID-19 restrictions, the annual wine tour was not held in 2022.

Several club members coordinated impromptu drives and other get togethers throughout the year, where people could meet safely outdoors.

CCBCC British Car Show

The 2022 annual CCBCC Car Show was again held in October, at the Channel Islands Harbor park in Oxnard, CA.

Most car show expenses (Harbor fees, security and rentals) remained the same as in prior years.

(See attached 2022 Car Show recap of Income & Expenses).

There was a significant increase in costs for the shirts and trophies this year.

We did not increase the registration fees, or costs for additional shirts.

The event still covered all expenses for the car show, mostly due to the large number of participants again this year.

If the cost of shirts, hats and trophies continues to increase, the car show committee will have to consider increasing registration fees in 2023.

Many other local car clubs have discontinued similar events.

If CCBCC continues to have the same high level of participation at the next car show, we can continue to sponsor this popular annual event.

Charitable Contributions

Central Coast British Car Club, Inc. is a non profit Mutual Benefit Corporation. Our club is not a public charity (it is not our goal to raise funds for charities).

It has been a tradition for Club members to donate time and tangible items to several local organizations. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, these activities have been limited to donations by Club members to the R.A.I.N. Project. Gift cards and bedding are collected at the annual Holiday Party.

Analysis of CCBCC Financial Statement for FY 2022

(Income Statement and Balance Sheet attached)

Membership

CCBCC currently has 160 members. Approximately 60 are "active", meaning they participate in several meetings or Club events during the year.

We welcomed 27 new members to the Club in 2022, with 8 new members joining at the 2022 Car Show in October.

CCBCC is an active chapter of the Vintage Triumph Register.

A minimum number of CCBCC members must also be paid members of VTR, in order for CCBCC to purchase liability insurance for Club activities through VTR. The annual premium for insurance for CCBCC club activities is based on

the number of current CCBCC members who are considered "active".

December Holiday Party

The annual Holiday Party was held on Sunday, December 4, 2022.

The party functions as the December membership meeting, and is the time that the Club votes on the Board Members who will serve for the coming year.

Opportunity Sales

A certain amount of profit is realized from the opportunity drawings held at various Club events throughout the year, mostly at the monthly Club meetings and the annual car show.

Some of the prizes are donated items, others are purchased by the Club.

Regalia

Regalia items are purchased in lots that will give the Club the best price.

Most of these items are sold at or near cost to CCBCC members.

There were no major purchases of regalia items in 2022.

Tee Shirts and Ball Caps

Club shirts are also purchased in bulk lots to get the best price.

Shirts, sweatshirts and ball caps are also sold to members at or near our cost.

We purchased new ballcaps for the car show in 2022, as well as new Club shirts.

Because of post-COVID supply shortages, there was a significant

increase in our cost for all clothing items.

Operating Expenses

Normal operating expenses include the annual fee to maintain the Club mailbox, liability insurance paid to VTR, and the fees for website management.

Administrative Items

The Club Board members voted to approve the purchase of traffic cones for use primarily at the car show. This was the only asset purchase in 2022. A list of club assets and the custodians are included in this report.

NOTE:

On February 16, 2018, the IRS determined that Central Coast British Car Club, Inc. would be exempt from federal income tax under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 501 (c) (7).
